Myrtle Beach, SC, September 4, 2019 – The Myrtle Beach International Airport (MYR) is open; however, airlines have canceled the majority of regularly scheduled flights for Thursday, September 5, 2019.

The Myrtle Beach International Airport (MYR) is open; however, airlines continue to adjust their flight schedules:

- Wednesday, September 4th, airlines have canceled a limited number of flights.
- Thursday, September 5th, airlines have canceled the majority of flight operations.
- Friday, September 6th, it is anticipated that airline operations will resume.

All airlines operating at MYR have posted “Travel Advisories” on their websites, providing instructions on how to re-book flights impacted by Hurricane Dorian.
