Horry County Department of Airports Spirit Airlines Announces New Service to Hartford, CT

Myrtle Beach, SC, January 25, 2017 – Today, Spirit Airlines announced new nonstop service from Hartford's Brandley International Airport (BDL) to Myrtle Beach International Airport (MYR).

The new nonstop air service will commence on April 27, 2017. Spirit will operate the new service, four time's weekly from Hartford, CT. The nonstop flights will operate on Monday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday.
