NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT FOR RUNWAY 18-36 REHABILITATION

MYRTLE BEACH INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT, MYRTLE BEACH, SOUTH CAROLINA

The Horry County Departments of Airports (HCDA), in coordination with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), announces the availability of the Draft Environmental Assessment (EA) for the permanent full depth and width runway pavement rehabilitation of Runway 18-36 at the Myrtle Beach International Airport (MYR), in Horry County, South Carolina. Pursuant to Title 49, United States Code, § 47106(c)(1)(A) and Section 102(2)(c) of the *National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969*, the Draft EA is being circulated for review and comment from the public and federal, state, and local agencies.

Comments from the federal, state, and local agencies and the public will be considered part of the Final EA. The Final EA will be submitted to the FAA for the agency's environmental determination.

Proposed Development Project: The HCDA proposes the permanent full depth and width runway pavement rehabilitation of Runway 18-36 (Proposed Project). Connected actions to the Proposed Project include the construction of a 6,800-foot-long temporary runway that would be situated between Runway 18-36 and the full parallel Taxiway B to be used during the rehabilitation of Runway 18-36. In addition, the HCDA proposes the construction of taxiway connectors (B3 and B4), 30-foot wide temporary runway shoulders, runway edge lighting, and stormwater system improvements. The temporary runway would originate at taxiway connector B5 and terminate at taxiway connector B2. After Runway 18-36 rehabilitation is complete, the temporary runway would be converted into a taxiway.

Summary of Impacts: A Draft EA has been prepared to disclose the potential economic, social, and environmental impacts of the Proposed Project. The EA discusses the Proposed Project, alternatives, and potential environmental effects in areas including Air Quality and Climate, Biological Resources, Hazardous Materials, Solid Waste, and Pollution Prevention, Natural Resources and Energy Supply, Noise and Noise-Compatible Land Use, Socioeconomics and Environmental Justice, Visual Effects, and Water Resources – Surface Waters. The research and analysis provided in the EA concluded that none of the impacts were significant.
