Military Training Exercises

Myrtle Beach, SC April 3, 2017 – An influx of military aircraft operations at Myrtle Beach International Airport (MYR) are expected.

Commencing today and continuing through April 10, 2017 expect to see an increase of military aircraft operations at the Myrtle Beach International Airport (MYR). Aircraft being flown as part of this exercise include:

- KC-707, aerial refueling aircraft developed by Boeing (identifiable by its 4-engines)
- F-21 KFIR, fighter aircraft developed by Israel Aircraft Industries (identifiable by its canards small forward wing)
- MK-58 Hawker Hunter, jet-powered aircraft developed by Hawker Aircraft (identifiable by its swept wing design wings angle backwards)
- Learjet, aircraft developed by Bombardier Learjet (identifiable by unusual pods attached to the underbelly of the aircraft)

The aircraft are using MYR as a base for training exercises. The aircraft operations will not interfere with the Airport's scheduled commercial aircraft operations. The training exercise is scheduled to conclude on Monday, April 10, 2017.
