Horry County Department of Airports April 2018 Passenger Counts Shatter Record

Myrtle Beach, SC, May 11, 2018 – During April 2018, a total of 232,094 passengers passed through the Myrtle Beach International Airport (MYR), an increase of 25.6-percent compared to April 2017.

At MYR, total passenger traffic in April 2018, which includes enplanements and deplanements, totaled 232,094 compared to 184,771 last year. The number of people arriving on flights, or deplanements, totaled 115,984 compared to 92,970 last year.

“April 2018 passenger levels shattered last year’s record, making this April the strongest in the history of Myrtle Beach International Airport” said Scott Van Moppes, director of airports. “This April, 9 of our 10 airline were operational and 31 of our 48-nonstop markets were being served. As we roll towards summer, our airline partners will continue activating air service from nonstop markets to MYR, pushing traffic levels even higher. The airport’s growth is being propelled by the popularity of the Grand Strand as a fantastic vacation destination but also for the fact our market has one of the fastest increasing populations in the United States. It’s an incredible time to be in Myrtle Beach, SC!”
